Diplomas are shorter and cheaper and get graduates into entry-level roles faster, but a BSc generally opens more doors over the long run — supervisory positions, specialisation into MRI or CT-specific technology, and better prospects in equipment training or sales roles later.

It's also worth asking prospective colleges how they handle radiation safety training specifically, since students should be getting hands-on instruction in dosimetry and shielding protocols well before they're anywhere near a live patient.
